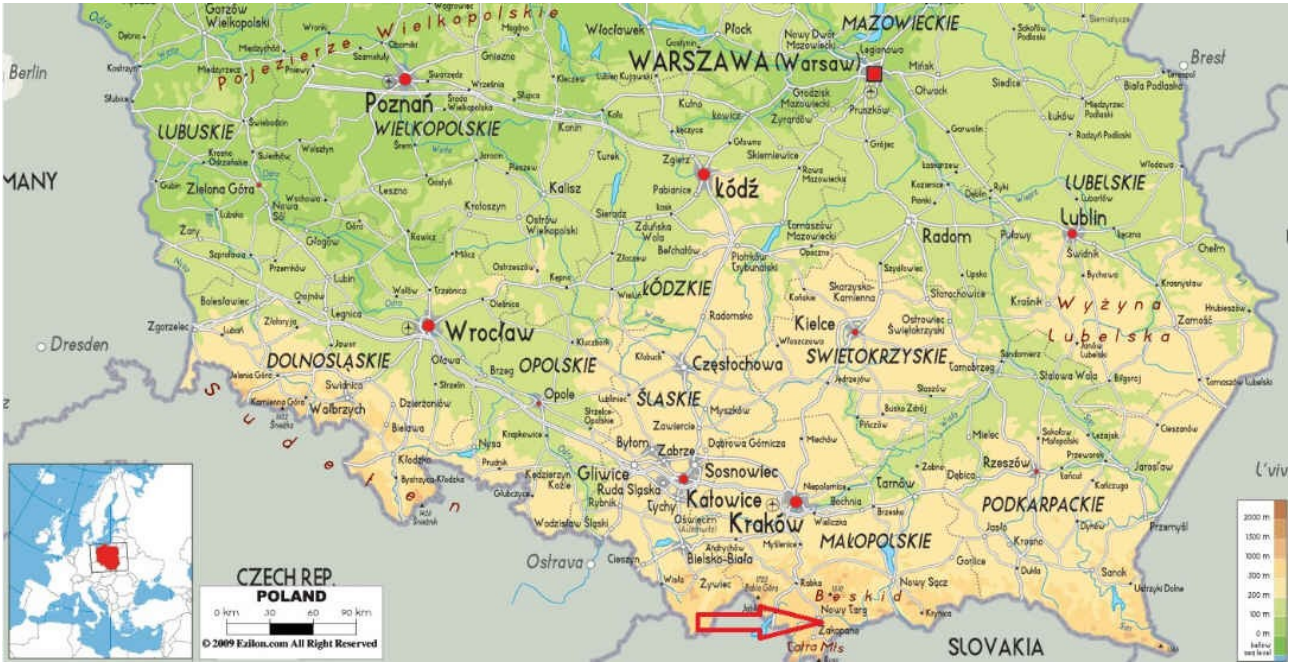

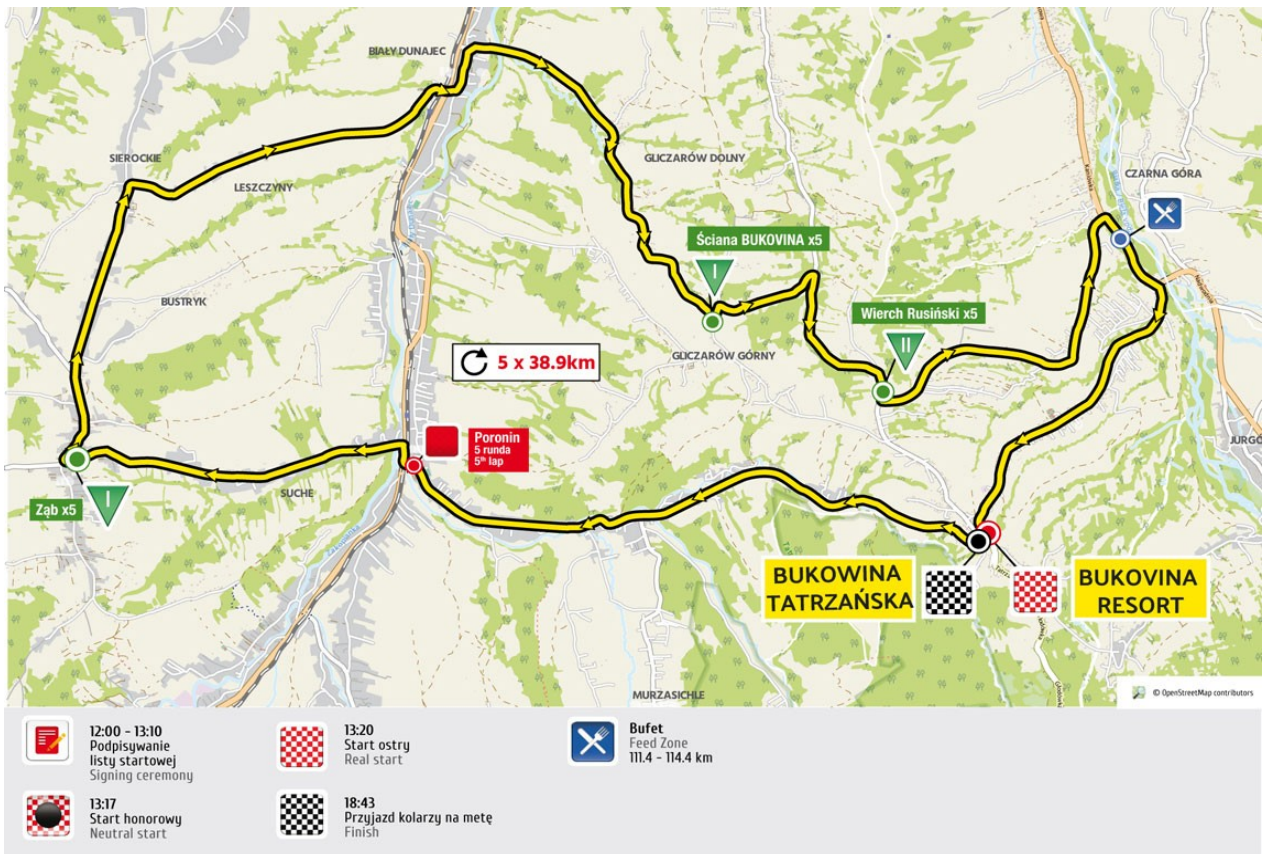

Tour de Pologne (in Polish in the text)

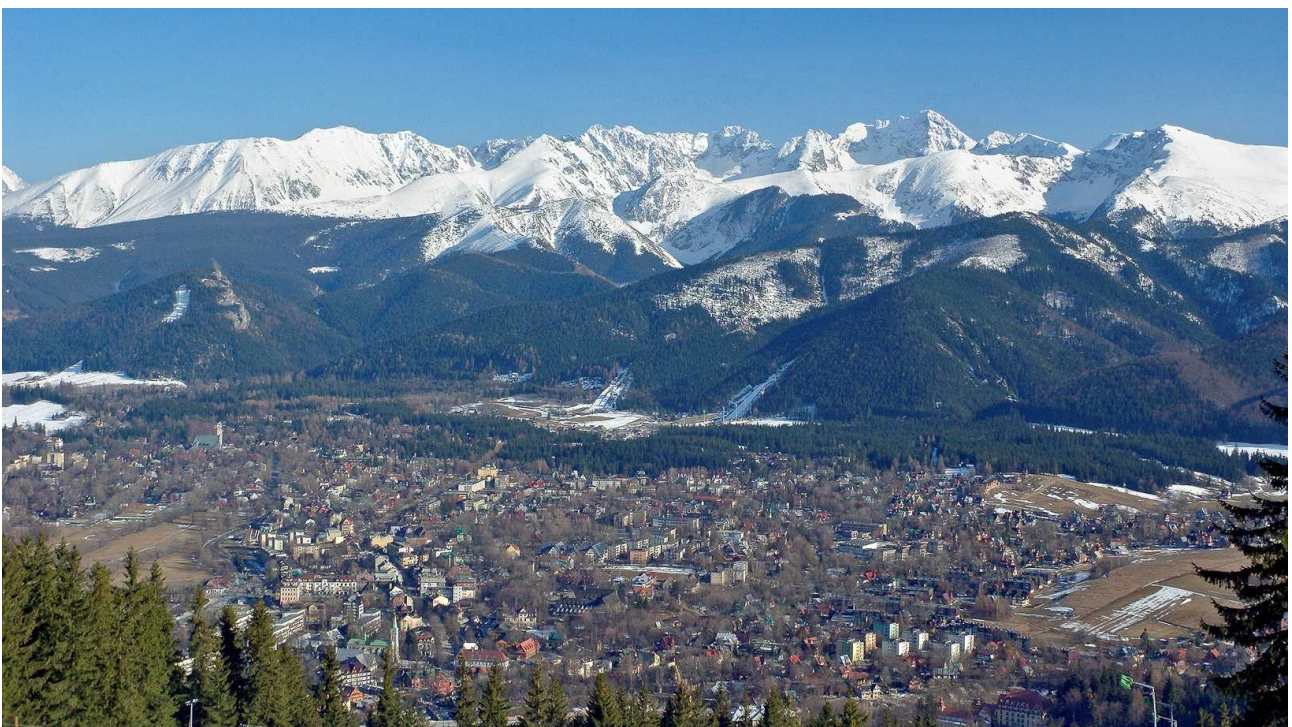
The typical media climb. It is on TV every year in the stage around Zakopane, the Polish resort of the Tatra Mountains. We can see riders going into the wall and flailing like puppets to ride out the 22%. And in 2016, they'll have to get over the top five times.





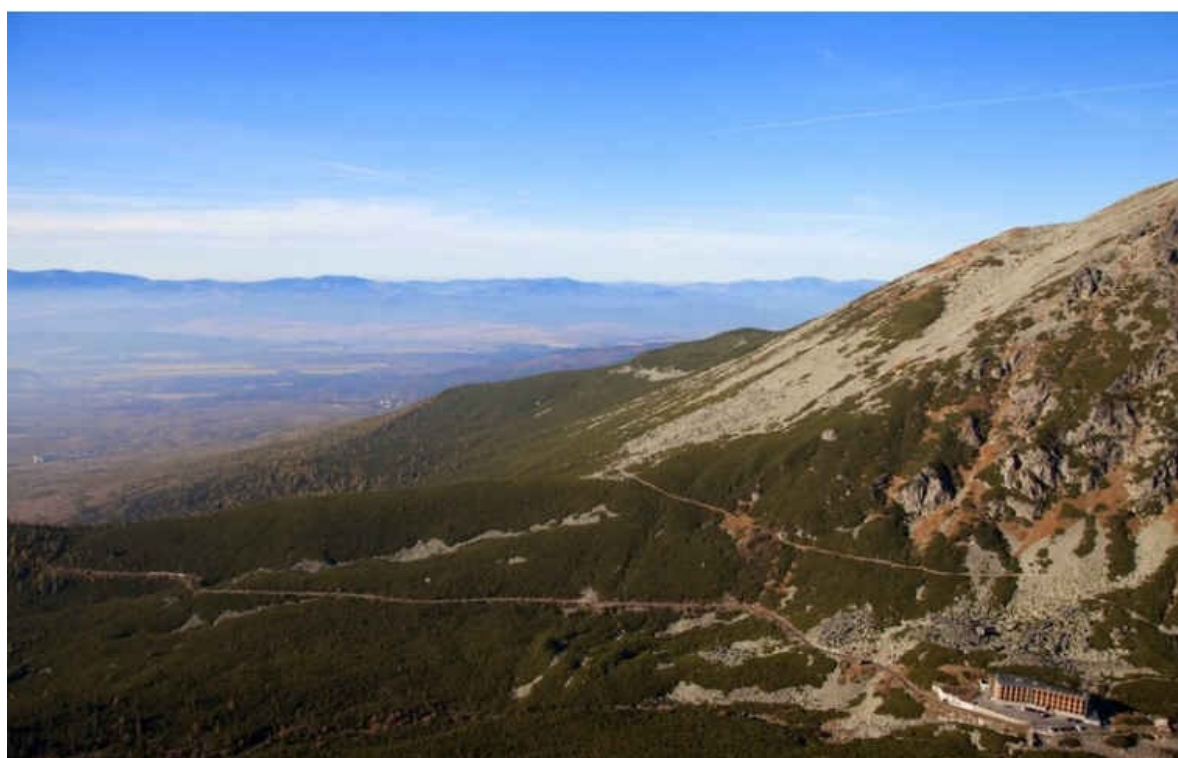
At the foot of the Tatras, the region includes similar short climbs. Ząb and Bukowina Tatrzańska (NE and W) are part of the same stage.

Głodowka (BIG830) includes Ściana Bukovina and the two sides of Bukowina Tatrzańska in their many accesses.

Not far from here, the Slovak Tatras also offer wonderful climbs, like Sliezsky Dom (1670m - BIG845), a 4-stars wall towards a mountain lake.
