## Vuelta a Guatemala

56th edition in 2016 and an international list of winners, exclusively Spanish speaking (25x Colombia, 15x the host country, 6x Costa Rica, 5x Spain, 3x Mexico, 1x Cuba and Venezuela). 9 days in 2016 and a route between the Ocean (Pacific) and the volcanos (Tajumulco 4220m, Acatenango 3976m, ...). The topography of the country allows to design a very good balanced route: flat stages along the seashore, alpine elevation gains (between 1500 and 2000m) and final jumps to cross over the highest altitudes, around 3000m. Not so amazing to see so many 3<sup>rd</sup> category KOM above 2000m.



## Zunil – Portrait



Profile 7th stage 2015

We've chosen Zunil, little town at 2100m. Not the highest « King of the Mountain », but the one with the best elevation gain. It lies on the road from the plain to Chimaltenango (2300m, 15km after Zunil). From there, it's possible to reach Alaska/San Catarina and Palestina de Los Altos at more than 2900m (see profile above).

From the bridge Puente El Niño, the climb is 39km long with 1740m elevation gain, that means 4,46% average gradient. Remarkable: the organizers put two intermediate KOM in the continuous climb, in **La Dicha** (901m) and **Santa María** (1526m). See the photos below. The altitudes are those of the route 2012. The profile of the 7<sup>th</sup> stage 2015 gives different figures.

End of the route 8<sup>th</sup> stage 2012

Openrunner gives a rather different distance (34km instead of 39), but a similar elevation gain (1712m against 1741m).

The km % allow to understand that La Dicha is only a 3<sup>rd</sup> category climb, after 15km at +/- 4%. Santa María (1<sup>st</sup> cat.) is another story (625m in 9km). Zunil (535m in 12km) in itself is not a 1<sup>st</sup> cat. climb, but its position in the race is strategic.

Actually, Zunil is not the end of the climb, that continues up to the plateau. After Zunil, we can find the following km %: 0,8 4,9 6,0 -0,2 5,8 3,5, ...
