


Štrbské pleso (1264m)

Tour de Slovaquie – Okolo slovenska

No Peter Sagan in the very international winner list, but a few well-known names : De Rooy (1978), Ivanov (1987), Tonkov (1989), Hončar (1993) and Vakoč (2013).

Tour 2017

A prologue and 4 stages. 14 KOM in the first 3 stages (5 1st cat. and 9 2nd). The highest heights are in the Tatras, both High and Low. They will be visited in the queen stage (the 1st), between Levoča and Banská Bystrica.

In 1st cat. :

Štrbské Pleso (1264m – 1st stage) Čertovica (1226m – 1st stage) **BIG844** Salamandra (792m – 2nd stage) Polana (532m – 3rd stage) U Štefku (508m – 3rd stage)

Topography of Slovakia



Slovakia is a mountainous country : most of the territory belongs to the Carpathians. The 2 most important ranges lie in the north (Tatra Mountains) and in the middle (Slovenské Rudohorie).


In the first, we can find, for instance, Ťatliakovo jazero (BIG843) and Sliezsky dom (BIG845) in the High Tatras ; Sedlo Čertovica (BIG844) and Kráľova Hoľa (BIG964) in the Low Tatras (Nízke Tatry).

In the second, with lower altitudes, Panské sedlo (BIG849) or sedlo Brezina (BIG963).

For sure not the most tricky climb in the Tatra Mountains, but amazingly ranked in 1st category. Fortunately the viewing pleasure is inversely proportional to the pain.

29,2km-623m elevation gain

The climb has 3 parts :

1- 15km very slight uphill, from Velika Lomnica to Starý Smokovec (Vysoké Tatry) = KOM 2nd cat.

2- 5km almost flat, 350m above the valley

3- 4 last km slight uphill = KOM 1^{st} cat.

The race doesn't go to the mountain lake (« pleso »). At the crossroads below, the riders go down straight to the valley, avoiding the dead-end road. But ideal place for an uphill finish.


Cherry on the cake : Sliezsky dom

If the climb makes you unsatisfied, we have some food to satisfy your hunger, at km19, in Tatranská Polianka. But the break will be hard and the slope will kill you. 7km at 10%, with max. 17% (100m), and even 20% (50m).

After Tatranská Polianka, no timeout. The narrow and not very busy well asphalted road becomes very steep.



Through the forest the slope is not less steep : 14%
